On Christmas Eve, Pope Francis opened the Jubilee Door at St Peter's Basilica to begin the Year of Jubilee. In the Catholic Church, a Jubilee or Holy Year is a special year of forgiveness and reconciliation, in which people are invited to come back into right relationship with God, with one another, and with all of creation.

This special year gives us the opportunity to reflect and to renew our relationships with God and each other. Pope Francis has called this Jubilee Year 'Pilgrims of Hope" and he asks us to be signs of hope for others, by putting Catholic Social Teaching into action through caring for our common home and supporting our sisters and brothers who are experiencing war, hunger or poverty.

A Jubilee Year is celebrated by the Church every 25 years. This has been the case since 1470, when Pope Paul II changed it from every 50 years.

Ian Murphy RECORKSHOP

Our Year 10 GCSE artists took part in a workshop this week with the renowned artist Ian Murphy. Originally from Wigan, Ian travels the world recording the places and spaces he visits, to produce detailed large-scale drawings and paintings, which he then exhibits and sells.

Ian brought in some fantastic examples of his paintings, drawings and sketchbooks, explaining how he records his ideas and then develops them. He then went on to demonstrate a range of techniques that he uses within his artwork that Year 10 went onto explore for themselves, with some very impressive outcomes. The pupil's work will form part of their GCSE coursework, and the skills and ideas will be further honed as they progress throughout the course.

The day with Ian was a super day enjoyed by all and hopefully this will be a wonderful memory that our pupils will take away with them, long after they have completed their art GCSE at Our Lady's.


