Question 2: How do scientists measure how big a genome is?



REFUGEE WEEK

As a proud School of Sanctuary, OLCHS celebrates Refugee Week annually in June. This year's theme was **Our Home** and in assemblies this week, pupils explored the theme of what a home is, and the contribution of refugees to the UK.

On Wednesday, classes from Year 7 and Year 9 undertook workshops led by James Trewby, of the Colombans. He led sessions about the process of seeking refugee status in the UK, shared the stories of some refugees he works with, and pupils made cards and wrote letters to some of the people James works with.



The OLCHS Charity Committee also launched this year's Refugee Week fundraiser: this year we are raising money for the RNLI who save lives at sea. The RNLI is celebrating its 200 year anniversary this year. On 9th July we will be doing a sponsored walk at school to collectively walk the distance of the English Channel and we invite pupils and staff to wear yellow - the colour of the wellies and jackets worn by the RNLI volunteers. Donations can be made via Scopay for pupils wishing to take part.

FOR THE RNLI

Following our celebration of Refugee Week, we are raising money for the RNLI, the Royal National Lifeboat Institution. Pupils are invited to support this charity by making a donation of £1 or more on SCOPAY. They can then swap one item of school uniform for something yellow on **Tuesday 9 July 2024.** They should still wear school uniform trousers or skirt.

Pupils wearing yellow may also wear yellow makeup and nail varnish on that day. Yellow ribbon (£1 a metre) and keyrings (50 pence) are also available from the Charity Committee.

We want everyone to get on board and show our love and compassion for the voluntary work that the RNLI does when saving lives at sea. Please donate £1 (or more) and wear one item of yellow for school on **Tuesday 9th July** to show your love and compassion for people around the world.
