Dear parents / carers,

As we reach the end of the academic year and the start of the summer holidays, I wish to offer my thanks to you our fantastic parents and carers and to our wonderful staff for continuing to work together for the benefit of our wonderful children. I also wish to offer thanks to our excellent governors who work hard to support, guide and challenge our school. They are very proud of our school and always have the children at the forefront of every decision they make.

We need volunteers to sort through the uniforms. Times & Dates for this will be confirmed nearer the time.


