





APPLICATION FOR LEAVE OF ABSENCE FROM MAINTAINED SCHOOLS

We would like to inform you of a new form that must be completed if you wish to request a leave of absence for your child. As you are aware, regular attendance is crucial for your child's educational progress, and the government has made it clear that consistent attendance is vital for student success.

Under current legislation, the Headteacher is only permitted to authorise leave in exceptional circumstances, meaning that absences should be kept to an absolute minimum.

Please use the form which can be found on the school website, to provide detailed information about your request, and we will consider each case carefully in line with government guidelines.

In our ongoing commitment to ensuring the safety of our pupils during their journeys to and from school, we kindly ask that you discuss the following routines with your child and support them in adhering to these guidelines:

- 1. Cycling to School: Pupils who cycle to school must complete a bicycle contract, available in the Parent section of our school website. As part of this contract, it is essential that pupils wear a helmet, have working lights, and ensure their brakes are functional. For their own safety, pupils without a helmet will not be allowed to leave school on their bicycle.
- 2. Journey Home: Pupils are encouraged to go directly home at the end of the school day. This is due to previous concerns involving children from other schools. Please note that pupils are not permitted to visit Mill Lane Park after school unless they are waiting for a parent to collect them.
- **3. School Uniform:** Pupils are required to travel to and from school in their full school uniform. Wearing our uniform not only upholds our school standards but also identifies them as "One of Ours", representing our school community with pride.

We appreciate your continued support in helping us maintain a safe environment for our pupils.


