MOBILE COMMUNICATION DEVICES

As of Monday, 24 September all devices which can be used to receive or send any form of communication must not be switched on and must be kept in bags during the school day. This includes iWatches. The process below will be followed when confiscating mobile communication devices:

- The Finance Office will text parents to inform them of the confiscation, log the confiscation in the confiscation file and deposit the device in the strong room until it is collected.
- Devices will be returned to either:
 - the pupil on the following day after 3.30 pm at reception, upon receipt of a signed note from a parent/carer;
 - in person to a parent/carer who calls into reception after 3.30 pm on the day of confiscation.
