## **FOOTBALL NEWS**

#### Year 7

On Friday, 12 October the team travelled to Broughton High School for their first ever game. It was clearly a nervous start for all the players. The home side pressed well and caused us a lot of problems. Consequently, Broughton took an early lead and they grew in confidence as the half developed. Our Lady's had their opportunities but couldn't finish them and at half time it was 4-0 to the home team. The players looked upset and deflated during the break but they were reminded of the positives they had displayed. We start again. 0-0. Let's see what we can do. It was an incredible second half! Our Lady's dominated possession and were breaking forward as a team, not just individuals. They put the Broughton midfield and defence under so much pressure, forcing them to make many mistakes.
