#### **WELLBEING AWARENESS WEEK**

This week was the second well being week at Our Lady's. Pupils have been focusing on one of the five ways to wellbeing, Take Notice. Different activities have taken place during form time for all pupils.

#### **ENRICHMENT DAY 1**

Year 7's Enrichment Day provided the opportunity for the pupils to begin their links to St Peter Claver's school, and Tanzania. Their introduction came through a variety of activities including learning about the History and Geography, Tanzanian Sports and Games, they learnt a little tribal dance and music, made Maasai shield key rings and Tanzanian textiles. They even got to meet some of the animals native to Tanzania! With this knowledge and understanding they wrote pen-pal letters which will be exchanged with the pupils of St Peter Claver School in Tanzania.

**Year 8** travelled to Rivington Pike to complete a sponsored walk. The theme behind the enrichment day was volunteering ourselves to help others. Every form has spent time researching various local charities that they would like to sponsor with all six forms choosing charities very close to their hearts. Pupils will now collect their sponsor money ready to invite a co-coordinator for each charity to be invited into school. A fantastic day was had by all.

Year 9 were looking at how healthy bodies, healthy minds and healthy eating impact on each other. The pupils experienced a variety of sessions over the day. Preston North End led sessions on the physiological, psychological and social benefits of sport with pupils doing a timed circuit session in teams. Lancashire Boys and Girls club brought in rowing machines, and other team building activities to look at the benefits of working together in a team. VRAI, led by Miss Gregson, looked at mindfulness and how training yourself to look at things in a positive manner can impact on your ability to achieve. Mr Bell and Mr Taylor led sessions on how exercise improves your cardiovascular health taking pulse readings before and after football and running activities. Other sessions explored healthy eating, how to make changes in your diet, lower sugar content and how to plan healthy meals and finally reflection and taking time to look after and believe in you own self. All pupils responded extremely well to the sessions and had a fun and educational day.

**Year 10** explored themes and ideas connected to Christian Stewardship. Pupils had the opportunity to engage with topics such as Stewardship of: Relationships, Dignity, Sleep, Talents, Time, Ourselves, Creation, Resources. The day was an eye opener for some and gave them the chance to see things from another perspective. In addition it emphasised the duty that each of us has to care for ourselves, each other and the environment.

**Year 11** experienced a day with a difference connected to the themes of relaxation and coping. They were able to take part in yoga, meditation and craft sessions, learn about how to deal with stress, be involved in team building exercises with the army and learn about resilience. Visitors from the army commented that our pupils were the best behaved and mature pupils they had experienced in many years of delivering such activities.

They have one night of fixtures remaining and both teams have their sights on reaching a league final in their first year at high school.

#### **RUGBY MATCH REPORT**

The team came together for the second time to play 3 mini games at Preston Grasshoppers on Thursday, 15 November in the Preston Schools' district competition. The team lost their second game to Archbishop Temple 10-0 as they couldn't quite cope with the speed of the opposition's winger. Our opponents won the game in the dying minutes after their powerful forward drove over the try line after we conceded a penalty deep in our half. The team thoroughly enjoyed their afternoon of Rugby and are looking forward to playing again in another 3 weeks.

#### YEAR 8 GIRLS' FOOTBALL MATCH REPORT

The Year 8 girls' Football team competed in a 6 a side tournament organised by Preston North End. There were 19 teams there in total and the standard was very high.
