YEAR 7 RUGBY SUCCESS

The Year 7 rugby team competed in their first games for school at Preston Grasshoppers on Monday, 18 November. Their opponents were Archbishop Temple and Ashton Science Community Science College. The team comprised of 15 eager young men who had a range of experience levels in the game. For most of the team it was their first ever set of games. The first game resulted in a 5-5 draw (1 try each) with both ourselves, and Archbishop Temple retaining possession for long periods of time putting pressure on their opposition's defence. Our Lady's were first to score after a winding run from Henry Latham saw him cross the try line, only for a powerful try scoring attack from an Archbishop Temple forward to leave the game a draw. The second game was much more one-sided. Our Lady's maintained pressure on an Ashton side that struggled to deal with our constant attack. Dylan Jackson's effective kicking put our opponents on the back foot and forced them into making errors to allow Hector Draper (2), Henry Latham and Dylan Jackson all to score tries. The final result was 20-5 in the favour of Our Lady's. The whole team was thrilled with their performance and look forward to the next round of games in three weeks.
