Teresa of Calcutta (Saint Teresa):

I worry that some of you still have not really met Jesus – one to one – you and Jesus alone. We may spend time in chapel, but have you seen with the eyes of your soul how he looks at you with love? Do you really know the living Jesus, not from books but from being with him in your heart? Have you heard the loving words he speaks to you? Ask for the grace: He is longing to give it.

# **OUR LADY'S CATHOLIC HIGH SCHOOL, SCHOOL BADGE**

Here is the history of our school badge which is synonymous with Our Lady's The badge is made up of three parts. One of the parts is from St Cuthbert Mayne, one from St Edmund Campion and the central part is from the new school Our Lady's. The rose symbolises the flower of Campion and also the red rose of Lancashire. The crown of martyrdom shows that both St Cuthbert Mayne and St Edmund Campion were martyrs. The castle symbolises Lancaster Castle because the school is in the Diocese of Lancaster, it also symbolises Launceston Castle in Cornwall where St Cuthbert Mayne was imprisoned. Our Lady of Fernyhalgh is in the centre of the badge and she is the patron saint of our school. There is a scroll underneath saying Our Lady's.
