FOOTBALL NEWS

The Year 7 football team have progressed to the quarter finals of the Preston Schools' competition after an impressive 2-1 victory against St Cecilia's on Wednesday, 16 March. It had been a few months since the team last played together and this was to be the first game playing as a 9-a-side team. A last minute pitch change meant that the team would have to play 11-a-side. This gave more pupils the opportunity to be involved in the game which in turn had a positive outcome for all. The game began at a frantic pace with both teams attacking using a long-ball tactic, pressurising the defence and driving forward with speed and directness at goal. The first half chances were dominated by Our Lady's with both Holly Wilson and Michael Dignan striking on target from their midfield roles, only to be stopped by excellent saves from the opposition goalkeeper. McKenzie Gavin in the Our Lady's goal was rarely tested however he had to be quick off his line to clear the odd through ball. The teams went into half time level at 0-0. Evie Mitchell was the second half goalkeeper and immediately had an impact on the game as a long kick out of her hands sailed over the heads of the defenders and Isaac Singleton pounced on the opportunity to collect the loose ball and drive forward into the box, pulling the ball back for Jayden Beetham to slot the ball home and take a 1-0 lead. Within 10 minutes the lead had doubled after Beetham converted another effort from further out that flew over the goalkeeper and into the top corner of the goal. A fantastic free kick goal from a St Cecilia's

forward cut the lead to 2-1 however the strong defending of Lincoln Smith, Finlay Mitchell, Alex McKeever and Ethan Downing prevented any further chances on goal and the team maintained their 2-1 lead until the final whistle. All players were thrilled at the win and look forward to a quarter final tie against Archbishop Temple in the coming weeks.
