Unfortunately, we struggled with our last pass into the circle and lost possession a few times. The game was 2-1 to us at half time. The second half was much higher scoring with both sides converting lots of their shots on goal. Unfortunately for us, Archbishop had a few more chances and the score finished 9-6 to our opponents. Player of the match went to Jemma McMaster, who put in a very strong performance at centre.
