

## What have we been learning this term in PE?

Boys and girls are taught in single gender classes and therefore cover slightly different sports over the course of the year. That said however, the aims and outcomes of the PE curriculum remain the same for all pupils - ensuring all learners have the ability to progress physically, socially and emotionally.

Boys began the year looking at improving their skills in Rugby and Table Tennis, and girls have

completed units of Badminton and Netball - the mix of team and individual sports allows for development of motor competence (the skills you can perform well) as well as personal skills such as resilience, perseverance and teamwork amongst many more. Over the course of a school year, our students will learn the different skills of around eight different sports.

These skills are revisited and further built upon year on year to show continual development and the opportunity to master the skills in their respective sporting area.



## What does assessment look like in PE?

Gone are the days where PE was just for those in the school football team and those who play sport outside school. Modern PE is about learning about the body and the ways in which we can lead a healthy and active lifestyle long after we have left school. With this, there is, of course, an element of lessons in which pupils are assessed in their practical ability and their performance, but there is equal priority given to assessing their understanding of rules, strategies and tactics along with their involvement in healthy competition -

two areas which have transferrable skills important for success in a wide range of career paths (not just those linked to the sports industry).

Pupils are continuously assessed within lessons looking at their ability to perform skills in isolation, their resilience at handling situations that may not have gone the way they expected, their analysis and problem-solving abilities and also their teamwork and communication skills. At the end of each unit, all skills developed over the unit will be assessed holistically within healthy competitive situations to allow pupils to practice and perform to their highest possible standard.

## Extracurricular opportunities in PE

The PE department have a huge extracurricular offering. Whether it is table tennis matches at lunchtime or netball after school, every pupil at Our Lady's has the opportunity to attend our clubs and participate in recreational sport.

We appreciate our lunchtime is relatively short therefore anyone wishing to take part in these clubs only need to change their shoes for their trainers - maximising the time being active and enjoying playing sport. Afterschool clubs allow for a lot more time and opportunity to focus on our performances therefore we do require attendees to bring their full PE kit.




